QUICK FACT:

3X KIPP alumni are on track to earn college degrees at **THREE TIMES** the national average for low-income students. Our goal is to close the gap on college graduation rates between our alumni and the students from the wealthiest income quartile.

ARE STUDENTS PROGRESSING & ACHIEVING ACADEMICALLY?

A 2023 study by Mathematica showed that KIPP middle and high school students are 31% more likely to complete college than their peers who did not attend KIPP but entered a lottery for admission. The study found the effect was great enough to “nearly close college completion gap between Black and Hispanic students and their peers nationwide.” At KIPP Miami, students are tested throughout the year, so we don’t just rely on state tests to know if they are on-track. Teachers have custom-built dashboards to make this data actionable on a daily and weekly basis.
